ITEM TITLE With chi will for hou	tty Frey moved, and Yvonne Stewart seconded: We would like funding from the 560 Tax-Credit idesignated accounts to fulfill the instructor roles needed for seven clubs throughout the school year. It an allotted 355 hours of extracurricular instruction for qualifying students for this school year. The ildren will qualify by signing up for a club and being accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. There Il be seven certified instructors with one classified assistant for the school year. The base hourly pay recrtified staff will be \$25 per hour. The classified assistant will be paid a base pay of \$15.45 per our. The estimated cost for the instruction of these clubs will be \$8,522.50 as an 'Added Duty- Tax edit' role. Additional details can be found within the proposition document and may be reviewed by
